"Some mid-week thoughts from Dave"

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ: Yes, I am the new pastor serving with the people of Christ at The Congregational Church of Topsfield. I have been asked to provide "Bridge Ministry" following the retirement of your pastor.

I will be serving initially 20 hours per week, with time in town and in the church office and writing and preparation time in our apartment in N. Andover. Over these next few weeks, I will seek to connect with the congregation during the weekly notes in the "InSpire" and share a story or two. I am most interested in your feedback and thoughts along the way.

I am providing my cell phone as a major contact number and feel free to call or text with pastoral needs or a potential emergency. We have heard this story before, but I would like to add a slight twist.

As a man was passing the elephants, he suddenly stopped, confused by the fact that these huge creatures were being held by only a small rope tied to their front leg. There were no chains, no cages restraining the elephants. It was obvious that the elephants could, at any time, break away from their bonds but for some reason, they did not.
