# **Scripture Reading**

# Galatians 2:15-21, 3:23-29 (NJB)

Galatians 2:15-21 'Though we were born Jews and not pagan sinners, 16 we acknowledge that what makes a man righteous is not obedience to the Law, but faith in Jesus Christ. We had to become believers in Christ Jesus no less than you had, and now we hold that faith in Christ rather than fidelity to the Law is what justifies us, and that no one can be justified[\*c] by keeping the Law. 17 Now if we were to admit that the result of looking to Christ to justify us is to make us sinners like the rest, it would follow that Christ had induced us to sin, which would be absurd. 18 If I were to return to a position I had already abandoned, I should be admitting I had done something wrong. 19 In other words, through the Law I am dead to the Law, so that now I can live for God. I have been crucified with Christ, 20 and I live now not with my own life but with the life of Christ who lives in me. The life I now live in this body I live in faith: faith in the Son of God who loved me and who sacrificed himself for my sake. 21 I cannot bring myself to give up God's gift: if the Law can justify us, there is no point in the death of Christ.'

3:23-29 Before faith came, we were allowed no freedom by the Law; we were being looked after till faith was revealed. 24 The Law was to be our guardian until the Christ came and we could be justified by faith. 25 Now that that time has come we are no longer under that guardian, 26 and you are, all of you, sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus. 27 All baptised in Christ, you have all clothed yourselves in Christ, 28 and there are no more distinctions between Jew and Greek, slave and free, male and female, but all of you are one in Christ Jesus. 29 Merely by belonging to Christ you are the posterity of Abraham, the heirs he was promised.

Rev. Jack Soper, a retired Elder in the North Texas Conference, was the Senior Pastor of Arapaho United Methodist Church in Richardson, Texas where he served for twenty-four years. He is the organizing pastor of Holy Covenant UMC in Carrollton, Texas where he served for eighteen years. Jack holds degrees in psychology, philosophy, and a Masters of Theology in Biblical Research from Boston University School of Theology. He has been involved in issues of social justice for his entire ministry with emphasis on refugee immigration, the death penalty, racial justice, LGBTQ+ rights and interfaith dialogue. For eight years Jack served as the chairperson of the Commission of Church and Society for the Texas Conference of Churches, the State's ecumenical organization. Jack is an instructor in the Course of Study Program for the North Texas Conference where for 18 years he has taught courses in Christian Ethics, the Hebrew Bible, the New Testament, and Theology for the Contemporary Church. He is married to Rev. Marti Soper, also an ordained United Methodist minister and former Director for the North Texas Conference Center for Leadership Development. They have four adult children and eight amazing grandchildren. Jack and Marti have lived in Topsfield for just one year.
