
Join local Parenting Coach Mel Peirce for a small group discussion on how to parent through it.

Boys and Girls Fall and Winter Clothing Collections for Community Giving Tree

Children's fall and winter clothing from newborn to size 7 is now needed at Community Giving Tree. Also, large size diapers size 4 and up including pull-ups are needed.

Giving centers are located in Boxford and Lawrence. They accept children's sizes, which are 0-3 months through teen sizes.

These clothes are bundled by size and given to low income families in Northeastern Massachusetts. They also accept baby equipment like car seats and baby cribs.

Preserving the Health of the Congregation During Worship

It appears that the respiratory illness season has already gotten underway in the New England area. Consequently, the Board of Deacons would like to remind everyone that the following measures may help to prevent the spread of infections of any type amongst the attendees at Sunday worship:

1) The wearing of good quality masks is effective in preventing the spread of illness from one to another, perhaps in preventing the acquisition of disease. The wearing of masks at worship will continue to be voluntary and participants are welcome to wear masks at any time.


