Jackson comes to us with glowing reports as to his musical expertise and personal qualities from his professor of piano performance at Bowling Green State University and his two pastors. Jackson is coming to the Boston area in order to engage in an advanced diploma in performance at the Boston University School of Music. He has committed to being on board no later than August 1st.
